

## 30 Day Carryover Expiration Notice

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Your child is currently receiving free or reduced-price meal benefits as part of the USDA 30-day eligibility carryover allowance. Eligibility carryover allows children to maintain their prior school year eligibility status for up to 30 operating days into the next school year or until a new eligibility determination is made; whichever comes first.

Your child(ren)'s carryover will end **September 22 2023**. If you believe your child(ren) should continue to receive meal benefits, please complete a meal benefit application and return it to the food service office by **September 22** to avoid paid lunch charges. Applications can be accessed by **logging on to [www.nwhite.k12.in.us](http://www.nwhite.k12.in.us)** and clicking on the **Skyward Family Access** tab.

The paid meal prices are as follows **Elementary \$1.50. M/HS \$1.85** for breakfast and **Elementary \$2.20. M/HS \$2.30** for lunch. If an income application is not approved by **September 22**, your child(ren) will be changed to paid status and charged the amounts listed above.
